Title: Strife

Meditation: Strife

I am a man of strong opinions and beliefs. Shocking I know. This has often led me into many situations that have put me at odds with people. Years ago, I worked at an Eddie Bauer store. This was my first retail job, and I grew to be quite close with many of the people I worked with. In fact, there are quite a few of them Katie and I invited to our wedding, and we would often go out on Friday night with them when I was the Key holder position, which was basically a manager position.

I worked at this job for three years before leaving to work at Walmart optical department, and I worked under three different head managers. The first manager who hired me we worked well together and understood each other. The second manager, well let me tell you things didn't go very well at first. Working in retail it mattered who rang the customer up, because the company kept track of your sales, and if you didn't sell enough you would be let go. I observed the manager putting in his own number when he rang up sales that I knew others helped with.

Now I shouldn't need to tell you that this didn't sit very well with me. It came to a head one night when he and I argued quite loudly after the store was closed as I defended another employee who wasn't getting credit for the sales that they were making. I remember walking out of the store that night with Katie and the other employee waiting for me and saying that I didn't know if I was going to work there anymore. That night I felt sick to my stomach and had trouble sleeping.

I share this story because when we talk about peace I think it's important to talk about what we mean for when there isn't peace. Most of us do not have "literal" war stories to talk about, and because of that when we talk about peace I think most of us do not really know what that means. Peace as a concept just seems to big for a conversation, much less our lives. The story I shared from my life I think is a little closer for each of us about what peace is and what peace is not.

The scripture passage today reads like a fairy tale. It feels like a version of peace that we will never see, a peace that is always a promise yet never truly delivered. Isaiah, when he wrote this passage, had an eye to the future. Some future time where peace is so ubiquitous that even mortal enemies will stay together. The New Testament authors read this scripture and interpreted it to be about Jesus. Now here is the thing with that. The New Testament authors interpreted this to be peace now- not peace deferred. So how can it be peace if there is still war? How can it be peace if we are still eating animals, and a lion is certainly going to try to eat a calf.

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I believe the key for this is to understand that peace is not the absence of strife, of fighting or arguments. These facets of our existence are always there. Peace instead is something we try to live out every day. Peace happens sometimes in the midst of that strife. Now I know some of you are wanting to know the end of my story with this manager. Well, I didn't get fired. In fact, we had a great conversation the next day and came to a better understanding of each other. We got along great and worked well together for another year before he left to work at a bank. I know we worked well together because a month after he left he came in to offer me a job at the bank he was at.

Peace is not a fairy tale. It is not something that is out there to be hoped for but never experienced. It is a reality we strive to live out every day. It is simply the good news of who God calls us to be. Amen.
